

A Message From Our Pastor...

Many childhood dreams are built on the fairytales we heard growing up. Kings and queens, princes and princesses fill the storylines of Disney movies and television series. "Oh to be rich and powerful" we say. Some may move their focus from Camelot to grand ambitions within a career. The stories we watched showed a spectacular image of reaching the top. One person who had it all and found himself at the top was King Solomon. He inherited his crown and grew the wealth and power of his people. He could have everything he ever wanted, but something was missing. Something huge was missing. As expressed in his words in Ecclesiastes, all of this work still left him empty inside. "Vanity, all is vanity" he says as he laments reaching the top and still not fulfilled in life.

In the first nine verses of Ecclesiastes 3, he names the different seasons we go through in our lives. Things come and go, and nothing ever changes. All of the wealth and power in the world did not give him any more happiness than the pauper on the street. But God shows up in verse 10, and his whole demeanor changes. Over the next few verses, he begins to see where we find meaning in life.

First, King Solomon directs our attention to an inheritance far surpassing the one he received from King David's throne. In Eccl. 3:10, he acknowledges the gift of life bestowed upon us by God. Often, we become consumed by the burdens and tasks of our daily lives, overlooking the abundant gifts we have been given. At the top of this list is the promise that we are heirs to God's immense wealth. We are, in essence, royalty (2 Cor. 5:20). Yet, what makes our inheritance truly remarkable is that this wealth is eternal, immune to the ravages of time. The gifts God bestows upon us are everlasting, a testament to His unwavering love and care.

Second, "God has made everything suitable for its time; moreover, he has put a sense of past and future into their minds." (Eccl. 3:11) We often get so focused on our present circumstances that we lose sight of the eternity ahead of us. All of the problems we face will eventually be behind us. In due time, God will accomplish all of His purposes. Sometimes, we just need to wait for the good to unfold before us.


Thirdly, King Solomon reminds us that God desires us to live joyfully in the present. The knowledge that the troubles of today will be overshadowed by the beauty of tomorrow should invigorate us to seize the day. "I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil." (Eccl. 3:12-13)

When we struggle to see beyond the monotony of our days and troubles, God wants us to see bigger across a larger piece of time. See the gifts God has showered us with. See the future as bright. Feel the joy from all of God's many blessings and live in the fullness of the Good News found in Jesus Christ.





BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF THE LAKELANDS REGION

We are having a blast at Summer Camp and have close to 100 members signed up for camp between Greenwood and Saluda. We also have about 45 youth each week in the Teen Center.

With your generosity and support, along with a few other generous donors, we are providing support to about 35 youth from the Phoenix Place Apartments. We are picking the members up at the apartments in the mornings and taking them back home at the end of the camp day. The members have been participating in all sorts of enriching activities. So far they have visited Wyatt Farms, Jumping Jax, and are eagerly preparing for an exciting trip to the Children's Museum as well as to do some planting in our community garden. Our Saluda Camp is participating in the Summer Reading Series at the Saluda County Library, and they were recently wowed by a magician!!

Our teens are also fully engaged and are participating in a Workforce Development series curated by SC Department of Employment and Workforce. In mid-June they had a chance to meet and engage with the three Superintendents from Greenwood 50 and 52, and Ware Shoals. The Superintendents came to the Teen Center and participated in a workforce activity with the teens. Next they will visit the Abbeville Medical Center, and their culminating event for the series is a trip to visit the Boeing and Dominion Energy plants in Charleston on July 10, 2024. Is Music a wise investment of our dollars?

We have a million+ dollar organ, played by a paid associate. We have a full-time director of Music Ministries, part-time Children's music director, and part-time Festiva Administrator. That's a lot of money directed to-ward music!

In many cases, music in church is also discipleship:

- putting God's Word into us,
- practicing Christian virtues whilst refining musical skills,
- proclaiming God's truth in love.

There may be other overlaps of ministry goals such as the fellowship of small groups, and the physical and spiritual care of our musical family.

But really, are these things worth all that money? There are those would answer "no way!" or "absolutely yes!" based solely on their preference.

But there's a much deeper rationale than "like" or "dislike." There is the centuries old tradition, dating back to Genesis, of how music expresses our faith, how music revives our souls (see THE Book of Psalms), and how our music blesses God.

So here is my surprise answer—the money spent is not worth the investment of our dollars. UNLESS we squeeze every last drop of advantage out of

- The organ and pianos
- The children's choirs
- The bell choir(s)
- The adult choir
- The Worship service

If we don't take the opportunity to promiscuously exploit the specialized gifts of those who lead us (not perform for us) in our own music making, we are guilty of squandering God's most precious gifts to us. Please don't think I'm tasking everybody with bell ringing or choir singing. Our worship has plenty of opportunities to incorporate even the most elementary of musical participation! On the other hand, if you have musical interest, skill (which can be taught) or talent, you have been gifted for a reason—usually to help lead. Just as ANY ability—those gifted in praying help those of us to pray, those gifted in teaching help us learn, etc.

For those in the congregation, let's lift our hearts and voices to worship, even if it is just to "talk" the hymns. And let's populate our ensembles with joyful ringers and singers, to the glory of nobody except the LORD GOD ALMIGHTY.

I'll end with an observation: when we have corporate prayers or spoken responses, you should hear how absolutely GORGEOUS the sound is from the chancel. Keep up the good work. It is so encouraging to hear you!


