A Message From Our Pastor...

On October 6th, we had one of the best worship services I have been a part of at First Presbyterian Greenwood. We were without power, lights, and organ, but we had an extra helping of energy. The Holy Spirit was present in a palpable way. Just nine days after the devastation of Hurricane Helene, many people were without power, and trying to put their lives back together. Half of our campus was inaccessible, but people came. In that naturally lit service, we came to worship. I made a joke about the installation of our new LED lights. Brad made a joke about a sermon he preached a few weeks before about the need to unplug. There was a strong cohesion among all who gathered.

Why was that? What made this service that much more meaningful? Some said it was the old familiar hymns we sang or the sharing of the communion table. I think there was even more that made it special. First, when life is generally going well, we complain about our "first-world problems" and overlook the simple blessings. When we were without power and some basic luxuries we began to notice and appreciate what we do have. We were thankful our loved ones were safe. We were not constantly distracted by our devices. Even the night sky was brilliant with stars.

Second, we experienced why Jesus called people together. The common struggle shared with our church family united and strengthened us. Jesus called us to think about our neighbor before ourselves, and this storm revealed the power of selfless living. Many joined together for a pot luck after worship and people brought extra food for those who couldn't cook in their own kitchens. There was also a collection of food to distribute to those in need. This is the Christian walk at its best

Third, without power and with limited luxuries, we were forced to slow down for a moment. We all need rest. We all need time in our lives for self-care and to breathe. Sometimes we need to stop and look around to see all of the good in our lives.

Worship on October 6th took us to the core of what worship is all about – God. We were less concerned about how we looked, the intricacies of the liturgy, the usual barriers we put between ourselves and others, and we simply brought what we had to the Lord. What a beautiful occasion and lesson. Let's not waste what we learned and experienced. Let's not go back to the old ways. Let's come every week with the simple goal of worshiping the Lord.





- · Exciting treats: Juice, Gatorade, soda







THORNWELL BELLS


