Have you ever heard or read of someone saying, "God told me to..." and wondered why you are not special enough to have God speak to you? Some use this statement to imply that there is a back-and-forth conversation from mouth to ear, as though God is hanging out in their living room. You may have thought, "I pray to God and invite God into my living room, but all I get is silence." If so, you find yourself among most people who seek God.



The Bible is full of stories about people hearing and communicating with God. As we read, these stories beckon us

to wonder how we can also hear God. One of the most common questions I get as a pastor is how to know what God wants them to do and how to hear God's voice. A very small few are so attuned to God's voice that they feel like God speaks to them every day. Indeed, God does speak to us every day, but it takes an effort on our part to stay tuned to God's frequency.

In the Pastor's Bible Study this winter, we will use a LifeGuide Bible Study entitled *Listening to God* by Carolyn Nystrom. Each Wednesday evening, we will open the stories of Biblical figures who have heard from God and discover the secrets of opening our own line of communication. 



MONTHLY MISSION SPOTLIGHT The Burton Center



First Presbyterian Church has helped The Burton Center in several ways over the years. It all began when the PW Thank Offering awarded a \$25,000 grant for a Sensory Park on the grounds that Endowment later supported. FPC has since provided fencing around their 1.5 acre fishing pond, funding toward the purchase of a 15 passenger van, helping fund a campus security system, and most recently helping to complete the project of installing cameras in their 53 vehicles. Our Sojourners Sunday School Class provides Christmas gifts for three BC individuals each year. The Burton Center is grateful to our church for our support.

Thank You Message from Greater Greenwood United Ministries

Rosemary Bell, the Executive Director of GGUM, sent a thank you letter to the individuals and groups from our church who gave financial support. GGUM was blessed to provide the following assistance in their parking lot the week after the storm:



- * 17,000 pounds of canned food (completely emptying their emergency food pantry)
- * Hygiene and dental kits, and children's books
- * 625 cases of water
- * 630 hot meals

UPDATE ON THE TEEN CENTER

From Sabrina Miller (Executive Director, Boys & Girls Clubs of the Lakelands Region)

The Teen Center is going well. We had some flooding during the hurricane that left us without power and services until late October.

Nonetheless during the hurricane we partnered with local entities to ensure our members were still fed each day and also helped the county distribute 8K MRE's, 4K bottles of water, and also toilet paper, trash bags, and treats for members of the community.

And although we lost furnishings and had some mold issues, we are happy to be serving members once again.

We have begun serving rising 6th graders in our Teen Center in an effort to provide a true continuum of service for the members we serve in our



Be Great Academy school based programs. So far we have enrolled 34 6th graders and 21 7th graders. We believe providing services to them at this critical junction in their lives will help to decrease suspension rates, increase academics, and also teach some much needed social and emotional skills as they head into middle school.

The Teen Center was nominated and was a Top Ten Finalist for the Furman University Riley Institute What Works Award. The award is for community based organizations that demonstrate strong partnerships with the surrounding school districts and make a positive impact in the lives of children. We are super proud to have been considered.

On October 24, we celebrated Lights on Afterschool which is a nationally recognized day wherein the promise and power of afterschool is highlighted. Our members traveled to Columbia for a larger celebration the week prior and we celebrated at the Teen Center on the 24th. We held an Open House and displayed art work and other mementos as well as provided information for parents and community members to showcase what our members do during afterschool.



Our members sent off approximately 50 shoeboxes that will be given to needy children in the USA and throughout the world.

Shoeboxes ordered on-line are specifically packed for sending to children in other countries.

Church History for the Month: A Legacy of Joint Sunday School Classes by Andrew Goforth

January is a very important month in the history of our Sunday School program. For many years, is has been in the month of January that our various adult Sunday School classes, and occasionally the Youth class, have come together into one large, combined Sunday School class in Alexander Hall. This joint class, nicknamed *Kaleidoscope*, is exciting both in terms of breaking out of the normal weekly Sunday School routine and in terms of the annual tradition that it has become. When viewed through the lens analyzing the development of our Sunday School program over the many years, *Kaleidoscope* signifies a brief and temporary return to "the old ways of doing things."

In its very earliest stage of development our congregation was merely one large joint Kaleidoscope-like Sunday School class. In 1850, under the leadership of Rev. John McLees, Rock Church bought the old Presbyterian High School building from the Greenwood Educational Association and converted it into a Sunday School outpost for members of Rock Church that lived near the town square. After renovations, the old High School building became known throughout early Greenwood as the Chapel, hosting afternoon church-school classes. Reports describe Mc-Lees preaching at Rock Church Sunday mornings, then commuting on horseback to the Chapel where he taught afternoon classes and led evening worship services for many years. The Chapel was originally a one room school building and later enlarged to three rooms through the additions of two wings on either side of the original building, which were used to for separate boys' and girls' classes, while the original room served as gathering place where worship services and other meetings could also be held. Because of the lack of space in the Chapel, Sunday School would have grouped the adults together, very closely resembling our modern-day Kaleidoscope. Over many years, the Rock members meeting for this Sunday School class eventually grew ready to formally separate from Rock Church, and in April of 1883 formally organized First Presbyterian Church of Greenwood.

The use of Alexander Hall as the *Kaleidoscope* Sunday School room is also ripe with historical significance. When built as our former sanctuary in 1899, there was a large Sunday School room connected to the former sanctuary and separated by sliding wooden doors, which would be opened for use as overflow seating during worship services or closed for use as a Sunday School Hall. Surrounding this Sunday School Hall were many smaller rooms that would house smaller Sunday School classrooms, architecturally modeled after the Akron Plan pattern found in many older churches across the country. In the early years after completion, adults would meet in this Sunday School Hall for a short session that introduced the main theme and then would separate the large class into smaller classes in the surrounding rooms. When our former sanctuary was renovated into the Fellowship Hall in 1959, the sliding wooden doors were removed, and the old Sunday School Hall was converted into the kitchen, while the smaller surrounding Sunday School classrooms were either retained as Sunday School rooms or converted into storage rooms.

For decades, the sounds of strong, solid, sturdy Biblical teaching have permeated the walls of Alexander Hall. This month, as we gather for our annual *Kaleidoscope* class, we join the countless number of people that have similarly walked through the doors of Alexander Hall and sat under spiritually nourishing and edifying instruction. In the annual *Kaleidoscope* class, it is our prayer that while we remember "the old ways" of conducting Sunday School, ways that gave birth to our church, our hearts would be stirred and our lives would be transformed to further shine the light of Christ into the hearts of those from every tongue and of every place.


