In a couple of weeks, we will celebrate the completion of the seasons we are currently in. It will all come together fittingly with the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Maundy Thursday is April 17th. Join us at noon in the chapel for a communion service.






Good Friday is April 18th. Join us for this solemn service beginning at 7:00 pm in our sanctuary.

So now we stand before the cross today In humble trust, invited here to pray.




Capital Campaign Timeline








Noah's Ark News

MISSIONS/OUTREACH

MONTHLY MISSION SPOTLIGHT The Din Family

Asher and Samar Din and their two daughters are still in Pakistan and are working to spread the Gospel. Samar is having several health issues including allergies, high fever, high blood pressure and elevated uric acid levels. They have asked for prayers. Asher wrote, "Your prayers mean a lot to us, and we appreciate any encouragement you can offer as we navigate these health concerns. She (Samar) is committed to improving her health and returning to a more active role in our work for God's kingdom."

Because of the generosity of our congregation, they were able to provide 150 pairs of shoes to children working in brick kilns. One child named Amina stood out during the initiative.

When she received her new shoes, her eyes lit up with joy. She had been walking barefoot every day as she helped her family at the kiln. As she slipped her feet into the shoes for the first time, tears streamed down her cheeks—not from sadness, but from pure happiness. "I can finally run without hurting my feet!" she exclaimed with a radiant smile. This small gift not only protected her feet, but also restored her dignity and hope for a brighter future.

Asher continues to preach and train pastors. He trained 30 pastors in February.

They are excited about the progress at the sewing centers. They have been thriving beyond their expectations, providing skill development and income opportunities for many women in the community. They plan to open two new sewing centers in March!

Future Goal: To establish a primary, middle school, and a technical training center for a brick kiln community. There are 180 children (85 families) at this location. Education is the best thing that can help and empower these families and help them to break the general cycle of bondage labor.



First Presbyterian Church Endowment 2025 Annual Report to the Congregation

What is the Endowment:

The Endowment is an incorporated arm of the church that oversees the investment and distribution of funds given by individuals to the church for specific and non-specific purposes. Beginning in 1986, the Endowment has managed funds received from the sale of property, wills, direct contributions, and sale of personal property. The Endowment Bylaws state that the purpose of the Endowment is to provide support and benefit, principally in the form of financial assistance to FPC for carrying out its religious, charitable, educational, and other related exempt purposes.

There are two funds within the Endowment, the Unrestricted Fund, and the Restricted Fund. The Unrestricted Fund is the largest, having \$2,918,836 as a 2024 year-end balance. The Restricted Fund has \$1,655,130 for a total cash balance of both funds of \$4,573,966. The Restricted Fund has thirteen categories within the fund with specific guidelines from the donor on how the funds are to be spent. Most funds have a limit on the amount that can be disbursed in a year. Six of these funds pertain to financial aid for students to attend college, nursing school, full time seminary, or Camp Fellowship. Other funds are restricted to use for Christian Education, Music/Arts, Missions/Outreach, sanctuary flowers, and Building and Grounds.

Most applications received by the Endowment are funded from the Unrestricted Account. There is a restriction in the Bylaws that Unrestricted funds cannot be used for maintenance and operations, capital outlay or debt service of the church. To provide an opportunity for members to contribute to the Endowment to address the physical needs of the church, a Restricted Building and Grounds and Equipment fund was established and funded in 2017. A minimum of \$25,000 is required to establish a restricted account.

The yearly budget is set according to the Bylaws to be a percentage of the market value of the unrestricted assets as of December 31st of the previous year not to exceed 8% during any calendar year. The 2025 budget was set at \$116,000 at the February 24th meeting of the Endowment.

- Remain accountable by seeking wise counsel, being transparent in dealings, and preparing to give an account of how resources have been managed, demonstrating integrity and responsibility in stewardship actions.



Church History for the Month: Elizabeth Blake Hospital

Nearly thirteen years after it was first organized, our church embarked on its first building project. By 1896, our congregation had outgrown its original building, built in 1875. In April of 1896, W. H. Bailey, F. B. Cobb, and G. A. Barksdale were appointed in a Congregational meeting to raise funds "for the erection of a new church building." By May of 1897, the congregation had raised \$12,000 to pay for the new \$15,000 sanctuary. Construction began the following year.

Around the same exact time that our church began construction on the sanctuary that became Alexander Hall, builders finished work on a brand-new hospital in Soochow, China.³ This new hospital was funded entirely by John Rennie Blake, a retired professor and member

of our church. Prof. Blake was born in Greenwood in 1825 as the son of William N. Blake and Elizabeth W. Blake. As a young boy, Prof. Blake attended Clear Springs Academy under the leadership of James Leslie and later, the University of Georgia, graduating in 1846. Prof. Blake then began a very successful career in education after first serving as personal tutor for the family of South Carolina Governor James H. Hammond. Prof. Blake eventually secured the chair of the science department at Stewart College in Memphis, Tennessee. After Stewart College was devastated by the Civil War, Prof. Blake served as a long-time professor at Davidson College in North Carolina, where he would eventually retire in 1885. Upon retiring, Prof. Blake returned to Greenwood and became an active member in our church.

The Elizabeth Blake Hospital in Soochow, China, named after both Prof. Blake's mother and wife (both shared the name Elizabeth), was built entirely from Prof. Blake's donations. At the time of Prof. Blake's death in 1900, the hospital had served over five thousand patients. In the wake of Prof. Blake's death, our church began to actively support the hospital. In 1901, our church committed to sponsoring a missionary at the hospital.⁴ Our church and the hospital maintained a very close relationship, with missionaries from the hospital often serving as guest speakers in our church, until 1937. In 1937, the Japanese army invaded China, and shortly afterward occupied Soochow. The hospital was shut down and destroyed shortly after.

Just as our forebearers embarked on a period of discernment almost a hundred and thirty years ago, we too are embarking on a period of discernment of our own. As we listen for God's guidance on how He intends for us to expand our missional capabilities here in Greenwood, so may we imitate those who came before us a hundred and thirty years ago, keeping our hearts open to the many ways that our church can also expand our capability for outreach in parts of the world that we may never see with our own eyes. As we reflect on the ministry and history of the Elizabeth Blake Hospital in Soochow, China, may we more fervently keep our Chinese brothers and sisters in Christ in our constant prayers, along with the many missionaries entrusted with preaching the saving grace of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ in a country hostile to the Good News of the Gospel.
