



Since 1988, the Thank Offering has funded \$27,782.761 with grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$50,000 to support ministries such as providing food and water, alleviating homelessness, providing education opportunities, promoting health and improving the lives of women and children throughout the world. At least 40% of the offering funds health ministries.

Fall of 2024 Thank Offering Recipients NATIONAL

Wanlyetu Consulting, Pine Ridge Indian Reservation: Dakota Presbytery. This grant will fund a program to bring back the Welcoming of the Baby Ceremony, significant in the Lakota culture, that celebrates the child's birth and provides an opportunity to teach parenting skills to new mothers. \$18,000

<u>Voices of Jubilee:</u> Presbytery of the James. Voices of Jubilee brings together incarcerated youth and their families with mentors who have experienced incarceration and with interested others who want to help. The project provides support for Virginian youth who are in detention and in prison and for their families. \$37,160

<u>SAFEchild (Stop Abuse for Every Child)</u>: Presbytery of New Hope. SAFEchild is a leading voice for child abuse prevention through evaluation, intervention and treatment in Wake County, NC. The grant will provide technology for the advocacy center. \$50,000

<u>Forward Paths Foundation, Inc., Central Florida Presbytery:</u> This organization works to positively influence atrisk youth in Lake County, Florida, with support to complete high school, attain a consistent work history and learn financial management skills. The grant will expand services to homeless, unaccompanied youth and those who are 18 and no longer eligible for foster care. \$50,000

<u>Peace Promise:</u> Presbytery of Carlisle. Peace Promise offers advocacy, education and economic empowerment to survivors of sexual exploitation and human trafficking in the Harrisburg, PA area. The grant will help equip and renovate a kitchen and employ survivors offering them on-the-job-training. \$25,000

General Assembly's Office of Immigration Issues. This office helps PC(USA) churches by providing advice and resources toward a more just immigration system. The grant will provide advocacy software that tracks legislation and gives users a deeper understanding of the issues and the ability to contact their lawmakers directly. \$15,000

INTERNATIONAL

<u>Democratic Republic of Congo, Presbyterian Ministries with Vulnerable Children:</u> This ministries protects and cares for at-risk children in congregations, neighborhoods and schools. The grant will provide training for an updated community-based model that builds on social safety nets so that this ministry to vulnerable children will become more effective and sustainable for years to come. \$50,000

<u>Higgins Brothers Surgicenter for Hope in Haiti:</u> sponsored by Heartland Presbytery. The Higgins Brothers Surgicenter provides the only 24/7 trauma and surgical care available in Fond Parisien, a rural region near the Haitian Dominican border. Funds from this grant will be used to purchase an ambulance to transport rural patients to the Surgicenter and will enable medical practitioners to visit distant villages to offer treatment. \$25,000

<u>The Thank Offering</u> supports ministries such as providing food and water, alleviating homelessness, providing education opportunities in promoting health, and improving the lives of women and children throughout the world in many ways. Thank Offering grants range from \$5,000 to \$50,000. At least 40% of the offering funds health ministries.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN GIVING MINISTRIES

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN is the women's organization in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the PCUSA, of which our church is a member. ALL women members of our church are included as members of Presbyterian Women (PW). Leadership for Presbyterian Women is provided in our church by our Presbyterian Women Coordinating Team which is made up of the officers, committee chairmen, and circle leaders. Our ministry is aligned around a shared purpose, the PW Purpose (PCUSA), which states, in part, that we support the mission of the church worldwide and build an inclusive, caring community of women that strengths the Presbyterian Church (USA) and witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom.

2025 Birthday Offerings Recipients

Since 1922, the **Birthday Offering** has funded \$38,266,583 in mission projects that continue to impact people in the United States and around the world.

<u>Windward Volunteer Housing Facility</u>: Leland Presbyterian Church: Leland, MS. Much of the population struggles with barriers to adequate housing, healthcare and food access, particularly when disaster strikes. This grant will help build a housing facility at the church to offer safe and comfortable accommodations including showers, laundry equipment and a kitchen to residents and volunteer disaster recovery groups. \$150.00

Red Cloud Renewable, Lakota Thiyuha Dome Home Project: Pine Ridge, SD: Tribal communities in the U.S. are experiencing a housing crisis, and the Pine Ridge Reservation alone needs an estimated 4,000 to 5,000 homes. This project aims to increase housing availability through construction of three innovative dome homes that are energy efficient, economical, simple in design and construction. Construction apprentices will gain experience in this building technique that can be used for other Lakota families in need. \$150,000

- 1.) Forgiven and freed by grace through faith, the central figure stands in praise.
- 2.) Rooted in faith, the trio of women emerges. The outline of the central figure forms a cross.

 We are Presbyterian women, engrafted in Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. It is no longer we who live, but Christ who lives in us.
- 3.) The right figure holds a book to guide her reading, studying, praying or meditating.
- 4.) The left figure reaches out to care for others as she shares, nurtures and heals. The circle represents the church worldwide where women offer their gifts and talents in the midst of the global community.
- 5.) The uplifted arms of the central figure reach out to embrace a just peace for the world.

 The relationship between the three figures depicts lives of wholeness rather than turmoil.
- 6.) The three women have no distinct features and represent all women. The shapes surrounding them express energy, strength and openness.
- 7.) Our name, Presbyterian Women, ties us to our denomination. The Bible represents the Bible depicted in the PC(USA) Seal.
- 8.) Guided by our Purpose, we witness to the reality of God's realm.



HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP PIN MEANINGS:

The caring, supportive hands represent women who seek to build an inclusive community of Presbyterian Women. The leaf represents growth of our personal and corporate response to Jesus Christ as we nurture our faith. The dove indicates our work for peace in our own lives and throughout the world, shown in the globe. At the center of the design is the cross, by which our sins are forgiven and we are freed to live in Christ, who is the center of our lives. The overall design is of a butterfly, the symbol of newness in Christ.
