A Message From Our Pastor...

Jesus' ministry consisted of teaching, healing, and feeding people. His miracles drew large crowds that followed him. Traveling along the road "to the villages of Caesarea Philippi, Jesus asked his disciples, 'Who do people say that I am?' They told him that several guesses had been expressed: 'John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets'. Their answer was not uninformed; some had heard about Jesus from others, some had witnessed firsthand, and everyone was trying to understand who he was. Their guesses are not too dissimilar



to our own as we hear about Jesus in church, in books, and from other people. We construct an informed picture of who this man was who walked the earth two thousand years ago. Some people participate in a church community to learn more and live as he lived, to love and care for our neighbors. As Jesus continued to walk with his disciples, he asked a follow-up question, one that I believe is what he really wanted to know. "He asked them, "But who do YOU say that I am?" (Mark 8:27-29) In this question lies the ultimate desire of God. It peels back the layers of one's faith, beyond mere knowledge of something, to expose one's personal relationship with God.

Easter is a beautiful celebration of victory when defeat seemed imminent. Millions celebrate the victory through song and ritual. But eventually, the question is before us, "Who do YOU say Jesus is?" Do you commune with him daily in prayer and study? Do you accept his call to put others before yourself? Do you lean on God's strength and allow the worries of your day to pass by without much effect? Easter is great, but ultimately, God wants your heart and gives you the most incredible gift this world has ever known: life. I pray we can all walk closer with Jesus this Easter season and make him a companion on our journey.





Now, I am excited that the Lord has opened a door for me to serve in France, a country whose language I have been studying for 7 years because of a coin flip. I pray that the land of Jean Calvin would be a bastion for the Gospel in the 21st century and beyond.

CHURCH PLANTING IN FRANCE

Lord-willing, I will join a team of 7-8 church planters in Paris in Summer 2025. Our goal will be to plant 4 Reformed churches in the Greater Paris area in the next 10 years. We will start out as interns working under Samuel Foucachon, a native French pastor. Samuel will train us at La Chapelle de Nesle, a French Reformed church that he planted in central Paris in 2012. The interns will also receive a seminary education from La Faculté Jean Calvin, a Reformed seminary in France. Once we have finished seminary, we will be split up into pairs to plant churches on the North, South, East, and West sides of Paris.

The Opening Ceremony to the 2024 Paris Olympics publicly mocked our faith. Really, it was a \$100 million advertisement for the need to send missionaries to France. These 4 church plants are a way for us to turn the other cheek and repay evil with good.


STEWARDSHIP

Tom T. Shelton, Jr. is a native of Greensboro, N.C. and a graduate of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, where he earned both a Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music in Choral Conducting. He is Associate Professor of Sacred Music at Westminster Choir College. Focusing on children's and youth music at Westminster, he teaches classes in conducting, sacred music and music education. In addition, he is the director of Children's and Youth Choirs at Princeton United Methodist Church. He is also conductor of the Westminster Neighborhood Children's Choir.

Mr. Shelton has a passion for music education in all areas: church, school, and community. He taught middle school choral music in Winston-Salem/Forsyth County for 18 years. During that time he was selected Teacher of the Year for both Atkins Middle School and Kernersville Middle School. In 1999 the North Carolina Music Educators Association presented him with the North Carolina Middle School Music Teacher of the Year award.

Mr. Shelton is an active member of the American Choral Directors Association. Past ACDA leadership positions have included serving as national president, Southern Division president (2011-2012), National R&S chair for Middle School/Junior High Choirs (2007-2009) and North Carolina president (2005-2007). Mr. Shelton has conducted festivals and honor choirs for elementary, middle school and high school students in 20 states and abroad, including the ACDA Central Division Junior High Honor Choir as well as All State Choirs in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, New Jersey, North Carolina and South Carolina. This past May, he was invited to conduct a Treble Choir Festival in Carnegie Hall, New York City. His compositions have been published by Choristers Guild, Colla Voce Music, GIA Publications, Heritage Music Press, Hinshaw Music Company, Santa Barbara Music Press, and Walton Music.
