The "true story" of "Silent Night" (Stille Nacht Heilige Nacht) involves Joseph Mohr, who wrote the lyrics in 1816, and Franz Xaver Gruber, who composed the melody for a broken organ in the Austrian village of Oberndorf in 1818. The carol was first performed on Christmas Eve 1818 to a congregation at St. Nicholas Church, accompanied by a guitar, because the church organ was damaged by flooding.

The song's message of peace and comfort transcended cultures and faiths, as evidenced by the story of German and British soldiers singing it together during the Christmas Truce of 1914.








MOVING FORWARD

Flow Chart for New Pastor Search



Pastor Search Process Explanation

The weeks and months ahead stand to be exciting as First Pres searches for its next called and installed pastor. Here's how the process will go.

On August 23, Presbytery approved Brad Christie.

COM and the Session will now collaborate on a mission study, possibly in early fall. This study will produce a clear picture of where the church is now and a vision for moving forward with new pastoral leadership. Once the mission study is completed, the Session, through a special nominating committee, will recommend a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) for approval by the congregation.

The PNC will publish a detailed description of the church and its vision. They will then receive and review applications from ministers seeking a call to such a church. Eventually, the PNC will interview a short list of top candidates and confer with COM about terms of call for the new pastor, who will then be presented to the congregation for approval.

The search for a new pastor entails many important steps, which cannot be rushed. The PNC will consult with COM throughout the process and report regularly to the congregation. The entire process typically takes at least a year to 18 months to complete.

Clearly, we need to keep this whole transitional season in fervent, concerted prayer! God is good. And God has good things in store for FPC. Thanks be to God!

Moving Forward

We're about to advance the **You Are Here** marker on our transition timeline (see opposite page). At their November joint meeting with the diaconate, the session unanimously approved a proposed **Consultant-Led Mission Study Process** for our church. The consulting group working with us is Pinnacle Leadership Associates based in Chapin, SC. David Brown, not our member David Brown but Consulting Coordinator at Pinnacle, will be our lead consulting partner. David has consulted nationwide for some 30 churches of various denominations, including Shandon Presbyterian Church in Columbia. We are in faithful, capable hands with David.

The mission study will encompass three broad phases. In **Phase One**, David will meet with the Mission Study Team (see below) and church staff to set expectations and map out a timeline and plan for the rest of the study. Also during this phase, the whole congregation will participate in a series of assessments that will produce much of the data needed for the study. Eventually, analysis of this data will be most helpful to the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

Phase Two will feature a series of listening sessions that culminate in what Pinnacle calls a Vision 360 Workshop. The whole church will be invited to participate in this retreat weekend, where David and the study team will guide everyone through feedback sessions focusing on the church's past, present, and future. The work of this phase—the feedback and collective discernment that develops through this time—will be at the heart of the final mission study report. And, again, the heart of that report will shape much of the PNC's work.

Phase Three produces the final version of the mission study report. Once completed, the report will be presented to the full session for approval. The report then will be presented to the congregation and to Trinity Presbytery's Committee on Ministry.

The plan is for the session's Administrative Committee to form the core of the Mission Study Team. But there is room on the team for anyone else who might want to be part of this crucial effort. A Replacement Vehicle for Burton Center

The Burton Center was created over four decades ago to provide free services to individuals and their families who have disabilities and special needs (autism, intellectual disabilities, head injuries, spinal cord injuries, and related disabilities).

Ranging from Adult Day Programs to Residential Programs and Supervised Living Programs, these services help their clients discover opportunities to mature, grow, and reach their full potential. They have community partnerships in Abbeville, Edgefield, Greenwood, Lexington, McCormick and Saluda counties.

The Burton Center currently has 51 buses and vans for daily transportation of their clients to and from the center or their places of employment. They average more than 45,000 miles each month which is 1500 miles each day with these vehicles.

On July 1 of this year, one of their buses caught fire and was destroyed. Blessedly, the driver was able to get all the occupants out safely.

Funds were needed to replace this vehicle. Our Endowment Committee provided \$15,000 to help purchase a 2025 Ford Transit 15 passenger van. This vehicle has many safety features that are not on the older yellow school buses like the one destroyed by the fire.

The Burton Center is located at 2605 Hwy 72/221E in Greenwood.

A Service of Lessons and Carols Christmas Eve 7:00 pm

The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was first sung in 1880 in Truro Cathedral at 10 p.m. in order to "get the men out of the pubs early so they would not be drunk for the midnight service". Our 2025 service is at 7, but of course, for different reasons...



This service follows a pattern of 9 scripture readings followed by carols. The carols take on the role of reflecting on each text and exhorting the congregation. The tone of the worship service is both solemn and joyful, reflecting the intimidating grandeur of the story—from Fall to Incarnation—and rejoicing in the love of God and the redemption that is ours through Christ.
